



2010 KPOA POLICE PISTOL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will apply.

Equipment & Ammunition: The purpose of the KPOA Championship is to encourage Peace Officers to participate in competitive shooting using their standard-issue revolver or semi-automatic pistol without having to incur the cost of additional or specialized equipment.

1. Service Revolver: A mass-produced, factory manufactured revolver with no external modifications except for grips. No internal modifications may be made that would render the revolver less safe than originally designed by the manufacturer. Specifically prohibited is any system of recoil control based on compensators, barrel venting/porting.

- (a) Duty-style rear sights may be fixed or adjustable. Manufacturer's sights may be replaced with service-type night sights.
- (b) Barrel length not to exceed 6 inches.

2. Semi-automatic Service Pistol: A mass-produced, factory manufactured pistol designed for police or military use. No external modifications other than grips. No internal modifications that would render the pistol less safe than originally designed by the manufacturer. Specifically prohibited is any system of recoil control based on compensators, barrel venting/porting.

- (a) Duty-style rear sights may be fixed or adjustable. Manufacturer's sights may be replaced with service-type night sights.
- (b) Barrel length not to exceed 5.5 inches.

3. Holster: A conventional, duty-style, right or left-handed holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw, or holsters which require releasing by insertion of the finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holsters must completely cover the trigger.

4. Ammunition: Minimum caliber .38 Special or 9mm Luger, no high speed or magnum ammunition will be allowed. After initial loading, all loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's belt. Any speed loaders, magazines, and belt carriers may be used as long as they are practical for police duty use. In determining whether a specific firearm, holster, or other equipment meets the spirit and intent as well as the letter of the rules, it should be remembered that it is meant to be a totally stock police duty firearm such as would be issued to a new recruit. The responsibility shall be upon the competitor to submit questionable equipment and apparel for official inspection prior to the beginning of the match.

Target: NRA Official Competition B-27 or B-27E targets and repair centers will be used.

Course of Fire: DOCJT 50 rd. Duty Gun Course. An aggregate score of the following stages (500 points possible).

Stage 1: 40 yards (6 rds.): 6 shots, preset prone position, 15 seconds.

NOTE: All fire from the 40 yard line will be single action for revolvers and first rounds from semi-auto weapons with hammers.

Stage 2: 25 yards (12 rds.): 12 shots, kneeling position, 30 seconds.

Stage 3: 15 yards (12 rds.):

String 1: 6 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position, 10 seconds.

String 2: 6 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position weak hand, 10 seconds.

Change Targets for Stages 4 & 5

Stage 4: 10 yards (12 rds.):

String 1: 6 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position, 8 seconds.

String 2: Repeat above.

Stage 5: 5 yards (6 rds.): 6 shots, strong hand only standing without support, 5 seconds.

Stage 6: 5 yards (2 rds.): 2 shots, strong hand only standing without support, 3 seconds.

NOTES:

* All stages begin with the shooter holstered & secured except for the preset prone position.

* After the initial loading command of the range officer, it is the shooters responsibility to ensure a loaded firearm during the course.

* No time allowances or alibi runs for stoppages or malfunctions.

* Penalty points will be assessed for late shots or shooting from an improper position (maximum value of the number of shots fired).

* Stage 1 will be fired from the 25 yard line at ranges lacking the 40 yard distance.
