KPOA Mission Statement: To advance the science and art of police administration and crime prevention; to develop and disseminate approved administrative and technical practices, and promote their use in police work; to foster police cooperation and unity of action, exchange ideas, information and experience among the police officers of this state; and to encourage adherence of all police officers to high professional standards of conduct.

Membership requirements:

To be eligible for active membership, one must be at least 21 years of age and should be employed full time as a law enforcement officer with powers of arrest in the state of Kentucky, Law Enforcement educators and / or administrators are eligible for active membership only if they served as a full-time law enforcement officer prior to becoming an educator and / or administrator. Information concerning prior service should be listed upon the application. The membership committee will determine eligibility. Retired peace officers are also eligible for active membership, these applicants should also list their prior law enforcement experience including their former rank, department / agency, and years of service.

To be eligible for associate membership, one must be 21 years of age and qualified by training and experience in police work or other law enforcement activities, or by other professional attainments. An associate member shall enjoy all privileges of active membership except those holding office, voting, or being eligible for death benefits. The membership committee will determine eligibility.

An honorary membership may be awarded to anyone by the Board of Directors; the recipients do not have to be involved in law enforcement. An honorary member may attend the Board of Directors meetings but do not hold voting privileges, or any other privileges as an active or associate member.
